

Sebago Lake Region

Please continue to submit photos of Sebago Lake and the tributaries that drain to it. Your photo must include an image of the lake or one of its tributaries.

Presumpscot River

The Presumpscot River is the outlet of Sebago Lake and also the receiving river of the Westbrook/Gorham Regional Wastewater Treatment Facility, so we are committed to helping keep it clean. Your photo must include the river.

Casco Bay

PWD is also committed to protecting Casco Bay. Casco Bay receives water from the East End Wastewater Treatment Facility, as well as wastewater treatment facilities on Peaks Island and in Cape Elizabeth. Please submit photos of Casco Bay in the Portland Water District service area of Falmouth, Cumberland, Portland (including the islands), South Portland, and Cape Elizabeth. Your photos must include water.





The Sebago Lake to Casco Bay calendar will be published by year-end. You are invited to share your photos for consideration. Once submitted, a committee of Portland Water District staff will review and select photos based on many variables.

Submission requirements:


- Each photographer may submit a maximum of FIVE unique photos a year. Each photo may only be submitted once overall.
- Deadline for 2025 calendar: August 31, 2024.
- High resolution photos only: minimum of 1 MB (equivalent to 1024 KB).

 Must be at this setting when the photo is taken. Photo resolution cannot be adjusted after it is taken.

 The internet provides many resources for setting cameras for high resolution photos.
- Digital photos preferred. Please email to sebagolake@pwd.org.
- Send uncropped, rectangular photos with a horizontal orientation. Vertical and square photos do not fit in the calendar layout.
- Photos must not be altered after they are taken (by color enhancement, filters, etc.).
- Photographs must include Sebago Lake, a tributary of Sebago Lake, the Presumpscot River, or Casco Bay in them somewhere.
- When you send your submission, please include:
 - 1. Your name
 - 2. Email address
 - 3. Age (if under 21)
 - 4. Month/time of year photo was taken
 - 5. Location of photo
- By providing photos, you agree to allow PWD to use them in the calendar and other materials. You will be credited when possible.

Songo Lock, constructed in 1830, is the last surviving lock of the Cumberland and Oxford Canal, a 19th-century canal in southern Maine. The lock is located on the Songo River, just above its confluence with the Crooked River at the northern end of Sebago Lake State Park in the town of Naples. It allows boats to navigate between Long Pond and Brandy Pond at higher elevation to Sebago Lake at lower elevation.

From Sebago Lake to Casco Bay

Portland Water District's mission is to protect public health, safety, and the environment by providing our customers first-class water, wastewater, and related services.

Sebago Lake provides one-sixth of Maine's population with reliable and safe water. PWD protects this precious resource through various activities and programs including land

conservation. One of our partners is Sebago Clean Waters, whose mission is to preserve 25% of the land that drains to Sebago Lake.

PWD also operates four wastewater treatment facilities that clean and disinfect wastewater before returning it to the Presumpscot River and Casco Bay.
