Logo Origin

Did you know that the Portland Water District logo first appeared in 1928 when famed architect John Calvin Stevens topped the new offices on Douglass Street with an extra touch, a copper weather vane showing a horse-drawn carriage sprinkling water behind it to keep dirt roads from becoming dusty clouds. It still sits atop the Douglass Street building, and it serves as PWD's logo to this day.
