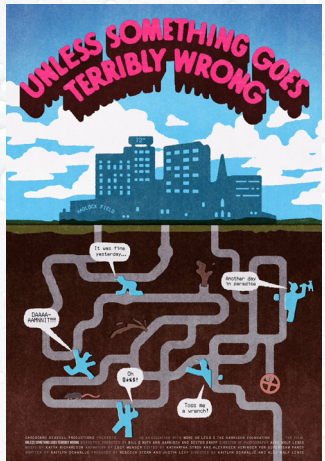
Documentary Screening
